The North Maharashtra University, (NMU) Jalgaon, established on 15th August, 1990 under the Maharashtra Universities Act XXIX of 1989, started its academic and administrative functioning from the academic year 1991-92. Thus, the above situation demands to discuss and finally to reach to a broader perspective on the country's national security perception & a wide spectrum analysis of how India is interacting with major powers of the world in order to maximize its security and growth.

In this proposed seminar, the efforts will be taken to address the crucial questions about India's national security in changing global scenario.
