# Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhari North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon 

Notification regarding online Pre-Ph.D. Theory Course Work Examination (January, 2019)

The Kavayitri Bahinabai Chaudhari North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon has conducted Online Pre-Ph.D. Entrance Test in the month of September, 2017. After this, the University has allocated guides to the PET qualified and PET exempted students and also conducted the course work workshop in the month of July, 2018. Now, the University has planned to conduct Online Pre-Ph.D. Theory Course Work Examination during January 19-21, 2019 at Online Examination Center, School of Mathematical Sciences of the University for those students who have already completed course work workshop. The details of this examination are as below:
a) The old batch students and foreign students who are eligible and wish to pursue their theory course work examination during the said period, will have to pay Rs. 1000/- and Rs.5000/-, respectively, as course work examination fees in online mode from their log-in.
b) The details of Pre-Ph.D. Theory Course work and syllabi for Pre-Ph.D. Theory Courses are notified on university website [www.nmu.ac.in].
c) The syllabus of the Pre-Ph.D. Theory Course-I i.e. Research Methodology has TWO versions each one for following faculties.
i) Science and Technology.
ii) Commerce \& Management, Humanities and Inter-disciplinary studies.
d) It is the responsibility of the concerned research supervisor to teach/conduct Pre-Ph.D. Theory Course - II i.e. Subject Specific Course and Course-III, i.e. Guide's Course based on research area, to the research students working under him/her and guide has to submit the certificate of completion of course work Paper I and II alongwith mark list of Paper-III.
e) The provisionally admitted Ph.D. students for Ph.D. degree (irrespective of their place of research work) will have to complete Pre-Ph.D. theory course work within one year.
f) The Examination of Pre-Ph.D. Theory Course No. I \& II will be conducted in the University. Both papers will consist of only objective type questions and held on January 19-21, 2019 in ONE session as under:

| Paper | Pattern/ Number of Questions | Marks | Duration |

| I | 50 questions are to be attempted | $50 \times 2=100$ | 1 hour |
| II | 50 questions are to be attempted | $50 \times 2=100$ | 1 hour |

g) There will be no negative marking.
h) Pre-Ph.D. Theory Course Paper-III is Guide's Course based on research area selected for Ph.D. For its examination, the guide should ask the student to deliver TWO seminars (on the selected research area) of 1 hour duration each using LCD and prepare the reports. The candidate will have to write Review paper on his/her own research area. The weightage for each seminar will be 40 marks and 20 marks for review article (Total marks 100).
i) The guide has to submit the reports of seminars and review article along with marks list [both hard copy and soft copy CD] to Research Section through the Director of School/ Institute/Principal of the College on or before February 28, 2019.

The evaluation of the Seminar components will be based on following four sub- heads.

## Standard of passing

The candidates are required to obtain minimum marks in Paper-I, Paper-II and Paper-III as given below, to qualify the Pre-Ph.D. Course Work Examination.

Note : 1. Only those candidates who will obtain the minimum required marks in each Paper, separately, as mentioned above, will be considered for final preparation of result.
2. Only those candidates, who qualify the Pre-Ph.D. Course Work Examination, will be eligible for submission of outline of Ph.D. research work and further process.

For Visually Handicapped (VH) candidates thirty minutes extra time shall be provided separately for paper-I and Paper-II. They will also be provided the services of a scribe who would be a graduate in a subject other than that of the candidate. Those Physically Handicapped ( PH ) candidates who are not in a position to write in their own hand-writing can also avail these services by making prior request (at least one week before the date of Pre-Ph.D. Theory Examination) in writing to the Pro-Vice Chancellor. Extra time and facility of scribe would not be provided to other Physically Handicapped candidates.
